## Reminders

The upcoming academic year brings new leadership in a number of collaboratives. We welcome the new leaders and thank the veteran leaders who have returned for another year. Additionally, we invite new collaborative leaders to reach out to <a href="Paulajo Gaines">Paulajo Gaines</a> or <a href="Ruth Hersh">Ruth Hersh</a> with questions or for support. We strongly encourage you to visit the School Finance: Educational Collaboratives <a href="Webpage">Webpage</a>, where you will find a variety of helpful resources including links to the FY18 Annual Report and Annual Independent Audit submission instructions. While there have been no substantive changes to our guidance in recent years, we encourage you to review all guidelines and guidance documents on the website, prior to submitting your required reports, to ensure that you are using the correct dates and the requested cumulative surplus calculation worksheet.

### Boards of Director Meetings – Each collaborative:

- must hold at least 6 (six) board meetings,
- must post the 2018-19 Board meeting schedule to the collaborative website, noting the date for the FY18 Annual Report and Independent Audit Report presentation and votes,
- must post all agendas and approved board meeting minutes per Open Meeting Law requirements, and
- should submit an electronic (pdf) board packet to ORG, prior to each scheduled board meeting.

#### **Board Member Management System (BMMS)**

- Board members must complete the online training within 60 days of appointment.
- Board members must revisit and complete the online training every 6 years.
- Collaborative staff must update board membership lists to ensure current compliance.
- Collaborative staff must retain board member completion certificates, on file, at the collaborative.

### **Annual Report** – Required content includes:

- information on all programs and services provided by the collaborative,
- · discussion of the cost-effectiveness of all programs and services offered, and
- discussion of the progress made toward achieving the objectives and purposes as outlined in the collaborative agreement.

### Annual Independent Audit - Required content includes:

- the names, duties and total compensation of the five most highly compensated employees,
- transactions between the collaborative and any related for-profit or non-profit organization,
- amounts expended on services for individuals aged 22 years and older,
- · amounts expended on administration and overhead,
- accounts held by the collaborative that may be spent at the discretion of another person/entity,
- · transactions or contracts related to purchase, sale, rental or lease of real property, and
- annual determination and disclosure of cumulative surplus.

### **Board Member Training Update**

The required board member training course has been updated and launched on the Board Member Management System (BMMS) platform. We thank you for your patience as we updated and tested the system during the summer.

As you are aware, all collaborative board members must take the training within 60 days of appointment and every 6 years thereafter. The system will send automated email messages to those who will need to retake the training. Copies of the notification emails will be sent to each collaborative director and ORG will provide specific instructions on the renewal process in the spring of 2019.

#### **Audit and Compliance Reviews**

This year, the Audit and Compliance unit will complete the 6 year compliance review visit cycle for collaboratives that began in 2013, with the passage of the collaborative law. We join them in thanking you for your cooperation with the initial reviews and for providing valuable feedback on the process.

For the next round, they will conduct brief check-ins to follow-up on and monitor the resolution of issues identified in earlier reports (e.g., internal controls, independent audit findings, material weaknesses, etc.). We will provide details on the process later this fall.

### Collaborative Board of Director Meeting Visits

This year, ORG staff will visit as many board meetings as possible, prioritizing the November and December meetings where the FY18 Annual Independent Audit and Annual Reports are presented for votes of acceptance. Due to staffing constraints in the ORG, we will attend board meetings upon request and whenever possible. Please contact Paulajo Gaines with scheduling requests.

#### Urban Leaders Network for School Climate and Student Support (ULN)

The ULN is a state network (similar to the Urban Superintendents Network) facilitated by DESE and partner organization, the School & Main Institute, where district leaders, school leaders, and DESE staff put a spotlight on school climate, social emotional learning, and student support. The network is a peer learning group, a place to share promising practices, challenges of practice, and be exposed to new content and ideas. Meeting topics this year will include: Chronic absenteeism, race/equity/inclusion, mental health and trauma, redesigning staff roles to support all students, and triangulating data for systematic use.
