Collaboratives' responses were immediate to address the needs of our students.


- Began providing remote learning immediately on March 16th; all by March 30
- Summer programs allowed us to gear up for the Fall
- Currently 77% of collaborative students are attending in person at least part time.

Collaborative students are in school!


Student Learning Models

Successes


Building on a Foundation of Strong Connections to Families

- Quickly pivoted to remote instruction and services with a focus on equity and inclusivity
- Established and sustained a level of rigor and highly personalized learning recognized by families and districts:
 - Student Remote Learning Plans
 - Special Education COVID-19 Student Learning Plans
- Positive impact on reducing the requests for Compensatory Services

Successes

Collaboratives provided timely support to our districts and one another

- Utilized our regional network to provide timely support
- Our district members turned to us as a trusted resource
- Facilitated Job-Alike groups for Superintendents, Assistant Superintendents, Technology Directors, Sped Directors, Business Managers and others
- Provided low or no-cost professional development
