This MOEC Leadership Academy, consistent with <u>Dimension One of the MASS REDI Guide to Getting Started</u>, is designed to immerse collaborative leaders in an intensive two day course with opportunities to reflect, learn, and build effective capacities to fully understand and lead the integration of DEI practices in their organizations.

This course will provide a unifying framework for DEI knowledge, skills, and practice. Through exploring emerging best practices and learning directly from a collaborative leadership team about their lived experience with DEI, participants will gain a rich theory-to-practice fund of knowledge to inform their work in their unique collaborative circumstances.

The goals of this program are to:
